

Letter from the Principal

Dear Mrachek Parents and Community,

Our school year is moving rapidly, third quarter is well on its way and we have much work to be accomplished. We will be assessing all of our students during the first two weeks of March in reading, writing, math, and science for TCAP. I am asking for your help to ensure that your student is well rested and on time during the assessment window. We plan on giving two assessments per day for seven days beginning March 4th to all sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students. Please refer to the testing schedule that will be sent home during the week of February 25th for specific testing dates. This is an opportunity for students to demonstrate their learning over the past year, and as you will hear often over the next several weeks, "show what they know".

In addition I want to bring to your attention a recent issue we are experiencing with which I truly need your assistance. I have received many phone calls from members of the community concerned about the safety and behavior of students when they leave campus. As you know the school day ends at 3:57 in the afternoon and we release 1000 adolescent students into the community at one time. Please ensure that your student is due home shortly after the day ends. Often young people make poor decisions when they are in the company of their peers without adult supervision. As the weather warms during spring months we often experience increased vandalism as students walk through the neighborhood. We will increase the adult supervision as students leave campus; however if students are accountable for arriving home at a specific time it will help get students home sooner. If you are willing to assist with adult supervision during after-school transition please give me a call.

The Mrachek staff is in the process of beginning planning for the 2013-2014 school year. The master schedule for next year is being built and will be finalized prior to Spring Break. Students will be registering for their classes toward the end of April. In addition, 5th Block invitations will be coming home for 100 students who qualify during the third week of March.

The Galaxy Initiative is a program for 6th, 7th and 8th graders who are interested in the STEM areas of science, technology, engineering and math. Applications will be available for a limited number of openings for seventh and eighth grade students. Please contact the main office for information. College Track recruitment is well underway and interested eighth grade students will participate in application workshops during the month of February, please contact the main office for specific dates.

As always we are in continued partnership to enhance your child's educational success.





possible. Your child should not return to child care until 48 hours after their symptoms have stopped, even if they just have one episode of diarrhea or vomiting.

News from the Nurse

Widespread gastrointestinal illness has been reported throughout Colorado and Adams and Arapahoe Counties including in several local schools and child care centers. We encourage parents and guardians to increase simple prevention measures to stop further spread of illness in our community. Symptoms of the illness include nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, and stomach cramping. We believe the illness is being caused by a virus germ called "norovirus." Norovirus infection is very common this time of year. Symptoms usually last about 1-3 days and can cause dehydration, which can be dangerous for children.

Stomach illness is easily spread to others when you have direct contact with another person who is infected, touching contaminated surfaces or objects and then placing your hand in your mouth, or eating food that might have been contaminated by an ill person. This is especially a concern in a child care setting where there are young children in diapers, and children play together and share toys. In order to reduce the spread of illness, Tri County Health Department has recommended that any child with stomach illness be kept home, and that staff encourage frequent hand washing and careful cleaning of the facility.

Please help to keep you and your family well by:


- Keeping your child(ren) home from school or child care for at least 48 hours after symptoms have stopped.
- Washing your hands frequently, especially after using the bathroom or changing diapers and before preparing or eating food or touching your mouth.
- Helping your child learn how to properly wash hands.
- Not sharing food or drinks with other people while sick or if others have been sick.
- Not preparing food for others if you have symptoms.
- Flushing vomit or putting it in a toilet or trashcan and making sure the surrounding area is kept clean and disinfected.
- Immediately cleaning any surfaces near where someone has vomited or had diarrhea and disinfecting the surfaces using a solution of one part bleach to nine parts water.
- Immediately removing and washing any clothing or linens soiled by vomit or diarrhea.
- If your child becomes ill while at school or in child care, you or a guardian will need to pick them up as soon as

Helpful Test Taking Strategies for Students

- Read the question.
- Make sure you know what they want you to do.
- Take your time. Don't give up!
- Read the title. Read the introduction under the title if there is one.
- Look at any pictures or graphs.
- Always read the caption on a picture. There will be a question about the caption.
- Think about what the author is really trying to tell you.
- Use reading strategies you have learned in class - like summarizing, making inferences, and picking out the main idea.
- Use complete sentences when you write.
- Repeat the question to start your answer.
- Look for italicized words and words "in quotations".
- Look for number words, "...three reasons..."

BEFORE THE TEST:

- > Practice reading directions on your own. Write in your own words what you are supposed to do.
- > Train like an athlete; read. The more you read the better you get at reading.
- > Rest! Get a good night's sleep.
- > Eat healthy.
- > Work hard.

Fifth Block

Aurora Public Schools offers a voluntary Fifth Block of Instruction for students who have shown academic growth during the school year and who could benefit most from additional learning time. The Fifth Block of Instruction is designed for any student who has demonstrated evidence of growth in math and literacy and who have the most potential to make progress toward proficiency. Priority is given to students who are not proficient in both literacy and math, both unsatisfactory and partially proficient.

Invitations will be offered to incoming second through incoming tenth graders who are not yet proficient but demonstrate evidence of growth. Fifth Block also includes incoming fourth graders who are low proficient in reading and incoming sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth and tenth graders who are low proficient in math. Students must have had continuous enrollment in APS for at least one year (March to March) consistent attendance and overall good behavior.

Fifth Block is provided to students at no additional cost to parents. Students are generally taught in their own schools using district curriculum. Class size is set at a 25 to 1 ratio.

The regular school year runs from August 7, 2012 – May 22, 2013. The Fifth Block of Instruction will be offered from May 28 to June 28 for the 2012-13 school year.

School staff will notify parents of recommended students beginning March 1, 2013 and parents must notify the school to accept participation of their child in Fifth Block by April 16, 2013.

Transportation, breakfast/lunch and nursing services will be available to students. There will be no need to reapply for free or reduced lunch.

El distrito escolar de las Escuelas Públicas de Aurora (Aurora Public Schools, o APS) ofrece una "Fifth Block of Instruction" (Quinta Sesión de Instrucción), en cual la inscripción es de forma voluntaria, para los alumnos que han demostrado progreso académico durante el ciclo escolar y que son los que más podrían beneficiarse de tiempo adicional de aprendizaje. La Fifth Block of Instruction, ha sido diseñada para cualquier alumno que ha demostrado evidencia de crecimiento en matemáticas y alfabetización, y que tiene el mayor potencial de progresar hacia el nivel de competencia. Se le da prioridad a los alumnos que no son competentes en ambas materias alfabetización y matemáticas, ambos de nivel insatisfactorio y parcialmente competente.

Las invitaciones serán ofrecidas a los alumnos que ingresarán al segundo a décimo grado, que todavía no sean competentes, pero que muestran evidencia de crecimiento. Fifth Block también incluye a los alumnos que ingresarán al cuarto grado y que están a nivel de competencia baja en lectura y a los alumnos que ingresarán al sexto, séptimo, octavo, noveno y décimo grado y que están a nivel de competencia baja en matemáticas. Los alumnos deben de haber estado matriculados continuamente en APS por lo menos durante un año (desde marzo hasta el siguiente marzo), haber asistido a clases en forma regular y haber tenido una buena conducta en general.

Fifth Block es provista a los alumnos sin ningún costo adicional para los padres. Los alumnos generalmente reciben la enseñanza en sus propias escuelas usando el plan de estudios del distrito. El tamaño de la clase se establece en una proporción de 25 alumnos por cada maestro.

El año escolar regular es del 7 de agosto de 2012 al 22 de mayo de 2013. Fifth Block of Instruction será ofrecida del 28 de mayo al 28 de junio para el año escolar 2012-2013.

Empezando el 1 de marzo de 2013, el personal escolar notificará a los padres de los alumnos que se recomienda que asistan, y los padres tienen que notificar a la escuela para confirmar la participación de sus hijos en Fifth Block no más tarde del 16 de abril de 2013.

Los servicios de transporte, desayuno/almuerzo y enfermería, estarán disponibles para los alumnos. Los padres no tendrán que solicitar nuevamente las comidas gratuitas o de precio reducido.

Attention Parents/Guardians

Have you moved? Does Aurora Public Schools have a current address on file for you? If not, you will need to visit Centralized Admissions (no appointment necessary) to complete the "Student Demographic Change" form. You must bring current ***proof of address and a photo I.D. with you.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. If I move from one address to another within APS, how do I enroll my child at the new school? Does my child have to change schools?

Any time a family changes their address, they must visit our Centralized Admissions site to verify residency and complete the Student Demographic Change Form. Once the address is verified, parents will be notified if there will be a change of school. If there is a change of school, you will be issued an admissions slip to take to the new school.

If the parent's address changes during the school year and the new address is no longer within the boundaries of the school, but still within the District, the student may complete the school year at the school the student is currently attending.

A student who becomes a nonresident of the District during the school year shall be allowed to complete the current school year in the school that the student is attending, unless that school becomes unavailable by the action of the Board of Education.

Q. I have several children that attend different schools. Will I need to contact them, too?

No. Centralized Admissions will change the address and Centralized Admissions will notify each school.

Q. If several families live at the same address will this change the address for every family?

No. Each family has a separate household even if they share the same address. The parent/legal guardian of each family is responsible for changing their own address.

Q. Where do I go and what are the hours?

Centralized Admissions is open Monday-Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. No appointment necessary. This office is open year-round (including fall, spring and summer breaks) but closed district holidays and winter break.

Atención padres/tutores...

¿Se han cambiado de domicilio? ¿Tiene el distrito escolar de las Escuelas Públicas de Aurora su dirección actual registrada? Si su respuesta es "no", entonces necesitarán visitar una oficina de "Centralized Admissions" (la de matriculación centralizada), en cuales no se necesita hacer cita, para completar la forma "FORMA DE CAMBIOS DEMOGRÁFICOS DEL ESTUDIANTE". Tiene que traer un ***comprobante actual de dirección y una identificación con fotografía.

Preguntas comunes

Pregunta: Si me cambio de domicilio a otro que también está dentro del distrito escolar de las Escuelas Públicas de Aurora, entonces ¿cómo matriculo a mi hijo en la escuela nueva? ¿Mi hijo necesitaría cambiarse de escuela?

Cada vez que una familia se cambia de domicilio, ellos deben visitar el sitio de Matriculación Centralizada para comprobar su dirección y llenar la Forma de cambios demográficos del estudiante. Una vez que se compruebe la dirección, se les notificará a los padres si habrá que cambiar de escuela o no. Si hay cambio de escuela, a ustedes se les entregará una nota de admisión (una "admissions slip") para llevarla a la escuela nueva.

Si se cambia la dirección de los padres durante el ciclo escolar y la dirección nueva no está dentro de los límites de la escuela pero aún está dentro de los límites del distrito escolar, entonces el estudiante puede terminar el ciclo escolar en la escuela a la cual asiste actualmente.

El estudiante que se convierte durante el ciclo escolares en una persona que no es habitante del distrito escolar se le permitirá terminar el ciclo escolar actual en la escuela a la cual asiste, a menos que no se pueda ofrecer esa escuela por alguna acción que tome el Consejo Directivo de Educación.

Pregunta: Tengo varios hijos que asisten a diferentes escuelas. ¿Tengo que contactar con las escuelas también?

No. La oficina de Matriculación Centralizada cambiará la dirección y Matriculación Centralizada notificará a cada escuela.

Pregunta: Si varias familias viven en la misma dirección, ¿esto cambiará la dirección para cada familia?

No. Cada familia tiene un hogar aparte aunque tengan la misma dirección. El padre/tutor de cada familia es responsable por cambiar su propia dirección.

Pregunta: ¿A dónde voy y cuáles son las horas de oficina?

La oficina de "Centralized Admissions" (las de matriculación centralizada) está abierta de lunes a viernes, desde las 7:30 a.m. hasta las 4:00 p.m. No se necesita hacer una cita. Esta oficina está abierta durante todo el año (abierta durante los recesos de otoño, primavera y verano), pero está cerrada durante los días festivos del distrito escolar y el receso de invierno.




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
